

Offshore renewable energy is only starting!

- Fast development North & Baltic Sea
- Taking off in Atlantic & Mediterranean with emerging technologies
- Good case for outermost regions & islands
- Good potential in the Black Sea





Anticipating future sea use - MSP











- MSP Directive 2014/89/EU implementation report 2022 7 MS still without plans


