Copernicus City Award

A "City Award" is a recognition given to a city in acknowledgment of its achievements in a specific field or its efforts to

improve the quality of life for its resident





These awards are based on **specific criteria** and assess the city's performance in areas such as innovation, sustainability, urban planning, and environmental protection.

The Copernicus City Award:

- Rewards cities that use Copernicus data and services.
- Inspires innovative use of space data for the city and the citizens.
- Objective: Raise awareness among local authorities and promote innovation.











Copernicus City Award initiative

Activities will be carried out as follows:

- 1. Set up the certification scale by investigating which Copernicus services are used by local and regional authorities and if there are awareness raising activities related to Copernicus
- 2. Define a communication strategy regarding Copernicus benefits for citizens.
- 3. Present and discuss with two test cities (Brest & Rennes in Brittany) about the initiative
- 4. Similarly conduct a survey with the stakeholders and the citizens to:
 - get their feedback
 - inform them on the Copernicus program and its related benefits to assess their views about their usage/interest in Copernicus.





Engaging Local Authorities:

- Raise awareness about the benefits of the label for development and innovation.
- Call for collaboration from local authorities to co-create the label and define its criteria.
- Establish communication and consultation mechanisms to gather their input.
- **Highlight the achievements** of participating cities and promote their involvement.
- Regularly monitor and evaluate the impact and effectiveness of the label.

Expansion of Scope to Other European Regions:

- Test Phase in Brittany evaluated effectiveness and challenges
- Extend the initiative's scope in a collaboration with European local stakeholders
- Adapt the initiative on regional differences and similarities
